From the Executive Director

Dear Donors and Friends:

Welcome to our annual summer newsletter. This September SisterMentors will celebrate its tenth anniversary and we have much to report about our accomplishments. Thank you for your strong, continuing support of SisterMentors.

One of our major recent accomplishments is that our first group of girls got accepted into college. Five twelfth graders who have been with SisterMentors since eighth grade will begin college this fall. Girls received admissions to universities including Duke, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Hampton, Howard and Virginia Commonwealth University. These girls had a head start from our mentoring sessions and college visits over the years.

In the meantime, thanks to your generous donations, in April we took 22 girls, ages 11 to 17, on a four-day college visit to Barnard College, Columbia University and New York University. For most of our girls, this was their first visit to New York City.

SisterMentors also helped another woman of color to get her Ph.D. bringing the number of women of color we have helped to 26.

We are continuing to work hard to reach our goal of \$120,000 by December in honor of SisterMentors' tenth anniversary.

SisterMentors is Sending its First Group of Girls to College this Fall

As SisterMentors celebrates its tenth anniversary in September, we will also send our first group of girls off to college. The following is news about some of the girls: Roxie Jairrels will start Savannah College of Art and Design in Georgia. Roxie was also accepted to the Art Institute of Pittsburg. Megan Tuck will attend Duke University in Durham, North Carolina. Megan also gained acceptance to Hampton, and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Shannon Scott will start Virginia Commonwealth University this fall. Shannon was also accepted to Fordham and Howard University.

Girls' Four-Day Visit to Barnard College, Columbia University and New York University

"It was a great learning experience. It opened my eyes to a lot of new things," said one of the 22 girls who in April went on SisterMentors' visit to Barnard College, Columbia University and New York University. Girls in fifth through eleventh grades from the Washington, D.C. area spent four days in New York City where they attended classes, interacted with women of color undergraduates, saw a Broadway musical and visited Times Square.

The girls gazed in awe at skyscrapers, marveled at the fast pace of the city and had lots of fun riding the subway. Thanks to the generosity of some of our donors, the girls' visit was made even more exciting when they were surprised with tickets for

The Color Purple Broadway musical. Almost all of the girls had never been to a show on Broadway. The girls were familiar with *The Color Purple* because they had been reading the novel and were introduced to Alice Walker during their mentoring sessions with SisterMentors' women.

Social Skills and Etiquette Workshop

"Today was one of the best days of my life," said one of the 25 girls who participated in our social skills and etiquette workshop in May. Thanks to support from one of our donors, Christine Boehm, SisterMentors had its third annual workshop led by Ms. Fannie Allen, of the prestigious Allen Etiquette Institute. Thanks to their commitment to supporting youth, the workshop was held at the upscale Madison Hotel, just blocks away from the White House. Girls were taught social skills including different ways to converse depending on the social setting. Girls were also treated to a four-course meal where they learned the etiquette of fine dining.

One More Woman of Color Ph.D.

This past April, Carol Hedgspeth became SisterMentors' 26th Ph.D. Carol received her Ph.D. from Howard University. She is the mother of three young girls, including a baby born in January. Carol plans to become a university professor.
